



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MONTHLY HIGHLIGHT



As highlighted in the January Monthly Femicide Report, half of all confirmed femicides this month were perpetrated by a family member, more specifically by the victim's adult son. While femicides in Ontario are most commonly perpetrated by intimate partners OAITH has continued to monitor increasing rates of family perpetrated femicides, which have been most commonly perpetrated by the victim's son. In order to ensure all types of femicide are addressed within violence intervention and prevention initiatives it will be imperative that these initiatives consider the multiple sources of gender-based violence (GBV), including not only current and former intimate partners but also family members such as a father, brother, son or nephew, as well as other known relationships such as a landlord or co-worker. For example, many existing GBV risk assessments and screening tools currently focus on intimate partner violence but ensuring all types or sources of violence are evaluated within risk assessments could ensure that an individual's risk level is not unintentionally mitigated. Furthermore, it will be important to ensure that a wide range of services and systems, such as the healthcare and mental health, child welfare and criminal justice systems, have the capacity to assess the risk of all types of violence and lethality. This will ensure that survivors who may be experiencing violence not perpetrated by an intimate partner, and who may not already be connected with traditional GBV services, can be connected with local services and supports that can collaboratively work to mitigate risk and increase safety.
