





Total VAW Expenditures

\$147M for programs that help **reduce domestic violence** funded by MCSS

↘ **53%** increase since 2003/04


VAW Program Expenditure

- \$85.0M** → 96 VAW Emergency Shelters
- \$29.2M** → Counselling Program
- \$14.9M** → Transitional and Housing Support Program
- \$6.2M** → Child Witness Program
- \$2.7M** → Provincial and Regional Crisis Line Counselling
- \$0.5M** → Indigenous Women's Help Line
- \$8.5M** → Other VAW programs, including domestic violence community coordinating committees
